


# Regional Peace Gatherings

## Why regional gatherings?

Our concern for peace is enriched by joint activity and by community. We would like to facilitate and support a variety of small events for Friends and Attenders to get together on a regional basis in the North of Britain. The gatherings would be opportunities for people to learn from and to support one another ...

- **Gather** for worship, conversation and discussion, reflecting and sharing information and ideas on peace concerns.
- **Meet and support** those from neighbouring Area Meetings in thinking and in taking action for peace.
- **Find out about and contribute thinking on** different aspects of the work of Northern Friends Peace Board.



## How, what and when?

- We expect these to be fairly **informal** and for the format to be **flexible**. They might be a whole day or just half a day. They might include a shared lunch, act of **witness** or some **practical** or **creative** action.
  - **Saturdays** are likely to be the easiest days for most people.
- We hope the gatherings will be **accessible** to those who would find it difficult to travel greater distances for other NFPB events.
