



NFPB meetings

NFPB members met in September and November. As well as hearing about and responding to Friends' concerns, our meetings are spaces for reflection and discernment, learning and connection, and for planning and reviewing priorities. Friends have attended from Area Meetings across Scotland, North Wales and Northern England.

In September, we were pleased to welcome **David Gee**, introducing a session on the importance of hope in our work for peace. David began by reflecting on the fragility of hope. He suggested that hope is a response to the need for realignment, responding to the old stories of success with a different vision. He acknowledged the sense of loss and despair that we often feel, but in activism these often sit alongside hope and joy, affirmation of those things that are life-giving. It can feel messy, but sometimes hope and history do rhyme. He asked us to reflect on how we cultivate that middle-space.



In groups and in further reflection with David, Friends heard of the importance of community, of getting together, of balancing the sense of urgency with a need to slow down, of giving ourselves the things that we need in the midst of action, of self-love and being the change we wish to see. Of living in the spirit.

David has written further on this theme in his recently-published book, *Hope's Work*. (see review at https://nfpb.org.uk/voices/review-hopes-work/)

Storm Arwen arrived the night before our members' meeting on 27 November. Plans for a fully-blended meeting were rapidly changed as trains across the north were cancelled and all but a handful of Friends were able to get to the Meeting House in Bolton. So most again joined via Zoom. We were pleased to welcome newly appointed members.

In our opening session at the November meeting, members shared **reflections arising from the COP26** conference that had taken place in Glasgow earlier in the month. Some Friends had been in Glasgow (and other cities), participating in demonstrations and a number of Friends had met with, supported and been inspired by some of the groups of walkers from different parts who had taken their witness to COP26 on foot.

Amidst the small steps forward in the conference itself, Friends acknowledged disappointment – but not complete surprise. Friends spoke of the encouragement they got from the energy and passion of the civil society presence, including opportunities to raise the voices of those most affected by climate heating, which can (must?) be built on in coming years.

Jo Frew, the Outreach Coordinator for **Rethinking Security** (https://rethinkingsecurity.org.uk/), joined us during our November meeting. Jo outlined the aims of the Rethinking Security and of their Alternative Security Review. NFPB is active in developing and promoting this and Friends were encouraged to help make connections and opportunities for local engagement. NFPB is also going to be running an online




Woodbrooke course with Rethinking Security on these issues during March 2022.

Challenging Militarism

Our **nuclear weapons** working group was reappointed in November and asked to continue its work, with the first meeting in March next year of states parties to the **Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons (TPNW)** (https://nfpb.org.uk/tpnw-info/) being a particular focus. We are part of the UK ICAN network and our working group plans to provide further information and resources in 2022 to support Friends in taking action.

We have run a number of **workshops** for Friends, including those during the Yearly Meeting Gathering, and for Friends in the North West of England, online and in person, focussing on different aspects of militarism and security. Following the workshop on armed forces covenants earlier in


